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Spotlight Project

Jackson G.'s project is to grow several types of plants--lettuce, basil, and strawberries--in a hydroponic system. The plan is to also grow these foods and herbs using the traditional soil method. Jackson plans to compare and contrast these two projects and then submit the findings in the FFA Agriscience competition. IT work and forming an Esports club are also on Jackson's project list.
